Please contact our office at 712-239-8670 if you could assist us in acquiring these items.

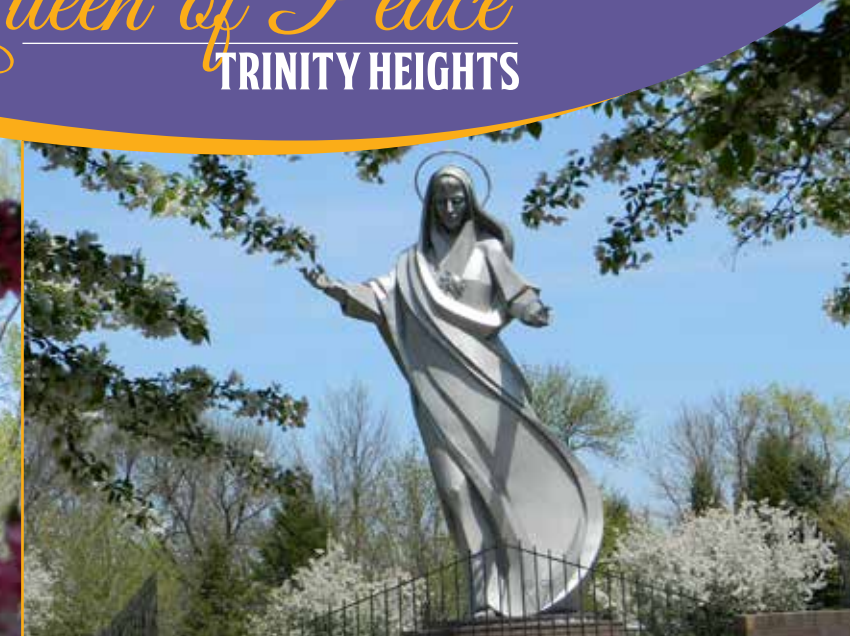
Message from the Executive Director
